The Programme speaks for itself; an evening of interesting music is assured. Maestro Erwin Marcus at the Piano needs little introduction. Formerly a Conductor of choirs, operas, and orchestras in Europe, and one-time pianist with Mr. Bruno Walter, he is now Chorus-master for both the Shanghai Choral Society and the Shanghai Songsters. Mr. Ferdinand Adler, violinist, born in Hungary, was trained at Budapest and Vienna and graduated from the Budapest Conservatory of Music. He was Soloist for the Vienna Theatre and performed for the Vienna Radio-Broadcasts. He gave his first public recital at the age of 13.

Miss Sing-Chao Kwoh and Mr. Chao-Tse Keh have both appeared at Community Church Concerts in the past, taking part in the performances of Beethoven's "Mass in C" and Gaul's "The Holy City." Both were trained at the National Conservatory of Music by Professor Chao Mei-Pa, a member of our Committee. The Organist is Mr. R. V. Dent.
